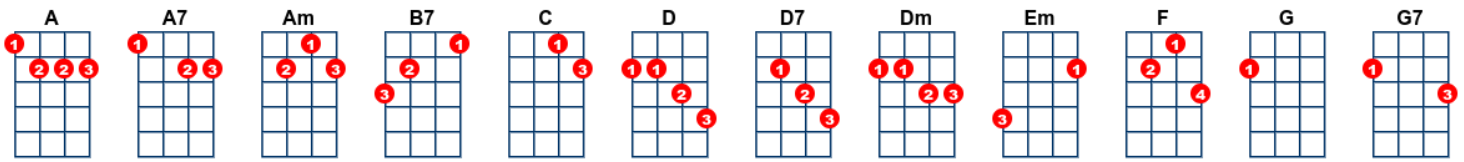


# Waiting At The Church
